

Electric Car Charging

David Killam writes: The article about the Studebaker electric cars from early 1900's in the last issue of StudeNews got me thinking. What did they use for chargers? I remember as a small kid seeing a bright orange glow inside commercial garages at night. My father explained that the glow was from a battery charger. Before the invention of diodes, the way to change AC to DC was with a vacuum tube. The amount of current required determined the size of the vacuum tube. A very large tube was required to charge a car battery and the glow from the filament became very bright. These chargers were not very energy efficient. An alternate way was to drive a generator with an electric motor. It was cheaper because any car generator and voltage regulator would work and could be powered by a washing machine or a water pump motor. Do you know of any other methods available back in those times? What was the 'home charging' set-up offered for your early electric car?

Although commonly considered a thoroughly modern invention, electric cars have been around for a long time. In fact, the first electric car was made in Scotland almost two hundred years ago! Of course, that vehicle was not any way practical for transportation, and it was more than a half-century before electric cars that could work in "real world" conditions were developed.

When the production of automobiles really got under way in the 1890s and the early 1900s, electric vehicles were as popular as gasoline or steam autos. They were cleaner, quieter, and easier to start and operate than gas or steam cars. They were especially popular with urban women drivers who had access to electricity and didn't want the bother of hand cranking a gasoline-fueled car. Women also had greater independence in electric cars.

Since hand-cranking the engine to start the car wasn't necessary on electric cars, women could drive where they pleased without being accompanied by a chauffeur.

Of course, if you owned an electric car, you needed some way to charge it. That's where this device (pictured above), called a mercury arc rectifier comes in. Just like today, the power that was delivered to homes was alternating current (or AC), but direct current (DC) was required to charge electric car batteries. So, a mercury arc rectifier's job was to transform the AC to DC.

Electric Car Charging

Until gifted to the Heritage Museums & Gardens in 2022, this mercury arc rectifier (pictured right) was still installed in its original location in Hull, Massachusetts where it had been for over one hundred years. In the early twentieth century, Daniel and Elizabeth Goodnow owned a waterfront summer home in Hull with an adjacent barn. This mercury arc rectifier was installed in the barn to charge the 1908 Bailey electric car that belonged to their 32-year-old daughter Fannie. Fannie would have undertaken several steps to get her mercury arc rectifier to work. After adjusting the voltage with the selector to the correct settings for the Bailey, she would open the AC switch line, set the current to high, then plug in the car. The next step involved flipping the main wall switch to apply AC power to a small pool of mercury in a glass tube on the back of the rectifier. The electricity caused the mercury to vaporize, and it emitted a purplish glow. Only the positive



portion of the electricity cycle can pass through vaporized mercury which creates the direct current needed to charge car batteries. After a quick check of the voltmeter and

amperage to be sure all was going well, Fannie would leave the battery to charge for about twelve hours.

The age of mercury arc rectifiers ended in the 1960s with the development of solid-state devices. However, some mercury arc rectifiers were in use in the New York City subway system until the 1990s! Nowadays, this same task is achieved using a semiconductor diode the size of a quarter.

Wheels

Any of the late 70's through '89 Chrysler, Dodge, Plymouth rear wheel drive cars will work. Some are wider than others. The '85- Fifth Avenue wheels work great on Studebakers having disc brakes up front, plus they hold the original hub caps too. Wheels from rear wheel drive, full size models of Fords fit on Studebakers as well. When looking for replacement wheels, make sure that the holes are not elongated. The elongation is a result of wear due to the wheel being on a car driven when it was loose. Regardless of whether you use Ford or Chrysler wheels as replacements use the Ford or Chrysler nuts which are 13/16" instead of the 3/4" ones that Studebaker used. "Why replace the wheels," you may ask.... It may be that your wheels are worn or cracked around the bolt holes or you may wish to use wider tires than the original ones. After changing tires or wheels, be sure to tighten them. Studebaker specifies 75 -to-83-foot pounds of torque for tightness. If tires and wheels are changed at a tire shop, ask that they use a torque limiting wrench for 75-foot pounds of torque. Some shops will try to tell you that their impact wrench used is set at the right pressure . . . Don't believe it! Over tightening or under tightening can cause wheel damage which is not immediately apparent. Over tightening can cause stripping of the treads on the nut and wheel stud. Also, you may have trouble to remove the wheel with the tools or strength that you have.

Grinding Noises

When you apply the brakes and hear a grinding noise that sounds like metal being scraped together, it may mean that you have worn brake shoes on drum brakes or worn disc pads on the disc brake system. It is generally caused by normal wear over a long period of time and it is the one problem that should not be ignored. Brake troubles always get worse. If you suspect that the scraping noise is coming from the braking system, get it checked out as quickly as possible. The cause of the scraping noise is bad and the damage that the scraping causes accelerates from bad to worse very quickly. Since the braking system is considered to be the most important in your car as far as safety is concerned, give it the attention that it needs. As a driver, your life depends on it.


Don's '57 Champion Project



Don Preiss has been busy on his '57 Champion project since the last newsletter. He still has lots to do, but he is making good progress. He saved the brake system from the Chevy van that he removed the engine from, installed it and added an extra firewall support (pictured left). The original pedal went through the floor and the original car design didn't have a strong enough firewall to allow the use of a hanging pedal. The new power brake system doesn't have the usual vacuum assist and

instead uses the pressure from the power steering pump. To the right of the brake pedal you can see the box board form used to shape a new transmission hump.

A similar form was also made for a new driveshaft hump (picture right). Lots of adjustments to be made to accommodate the new driveline system. The drive shaft has been installed. The original aluminum driveshaft had to be shortened and a Ford yoke attached to the back end to fit to the donor replacement Ranger rear end. Once the driveshaft was in place Don had to adjust it so that there was a sufficient angle at each end so the universals would



work properly. Strangely, universals don't work well if they are not a straight line!

The newly shaped transmission and driveshaft covers tack welded in place. Once the paper forms were made club member Wilson Baker was able to form the metal into the basic shapes needed. Don and his welding buddy Colin got the new metal in place.



Here's the completed job (pictured left). Don has used seam seal on all the joints. He will also seal all the joints on the underside.

Meanwhile Don has started to install the new wiring harness (pictured right). The LS Chevy engine and transmission are controlled by a computer. Don purchased a new kit that is available for this engine/trans install.



Right now Don is puzzling over what to do about the dash (pictured left). The old speedometer won't work because the new transmission doesn't take a speedometer



cable. The other gauges will all be a challenge to make workable with the new engine and wiring harness. So he will need to decide what to use - adapt the old gauges somehow or maybe install dash components from the Chevy van or maybe use an after market speedometer, tach and gauge package built specifically for the new harness.

With many challenges ahead and with complicated solutions there is lots to think about, but Don is good with automotive electrics.

With all this going on Don has still found time to overhaul the brake system on the donor Ford Ranger rear end (pictured right).



Trim Work on the '66 Commander

I have a complete set of wide trim for my '66 Commander. Not year correct, but I think it will give the 4 door car a longer lower look.

My plan is to sand the aluminum trim and paint with a black pinstripe. Hard to see but the bottom piece buffed up nicely, the middle one buffed up not so nice as the original aluminum finish was corroded off, so this meant that I couldn't easily buff to a nice finish. The top piece has been sanded.



I did the same with the trim on my formerly owned '74 Dodge. In that case, I pained the centre of the aluminum and cast trim sections; first in a metal flake wheel silver and then painted the centre section in black and finished with clear coat.



I started with 600 grit, but it wasn't enough to easily remove rust stains and left over masking tape glue. The 400 grit worked much better. Both papers are wet sanding type which I find much better than regular paper for this type of work. I also needed to use my body hammer and wooded blocks to take out any dings as I went along.





Trim Work on the '66 Commander

With all the trim sanded it was time to get the clips organized.

In my collection of parts for the '66 I did have some new clips. Each clip has a rubber like seal to fill the mounting hole so that water, mud, etc doesn't flow out and down the side of the fender - the front and back sections of the trim's clips pass into the wheel wells.

I had lots of other used clips where the rubber seals were deteriorated, so I cut out some softer rubber about the same thickness and width of the originals, punched holes in them using a leather punch and slipped them in place. Should work OK. I hope. I think I will add a bit of silicone to each clip to help get a good seal.

I'm using nails to hold the trim strips up from the inside (below right). This way I should be able to paint around the edges of each strip.

Next: Since I don't have a warm painting area I'll have to way for a warm day to get the trim painted. I've ordered the 1/8" black trim tape and hope to see it within a week.


