
Zoom Presentation

Studebaker Service Pins

Editors Note:

The late Chuck Naugle had a collection of service pins (See Turning Wheels March 2017 issue page 44) at the time of the writing the pins were being sold as part of Mr. Naugle's estate.

As we all know the Studebaker Corporation started in 1852 just as a small family business that grew to become the largest producers of wagons in the world by the turn of 20th century. Studebaker in 1923 realized it was time to celebrate their employees service by awarding them with years of service medals. From 1923 through 1933 they awarded their 1st generation of service pins that looked more like war medals for 5 year (copper), 10 year (bronze), 15 year (silver) and 20 year (14 K gold). The front of the medals was all the same with the likeness of J.M. Studebaker with the inscription "The Studebaker Corporation. Established 1852.



On the backs of these pins was the Studebaker Wheel emblem along with employee's name engraved which was a nice touch that only happened on this series of employees service pins. My 5-year medal was awarded to a F.L. Miller. The 10-year medal was awarded to A.G. Koenig. Both the 15 & 20 are the same employee D. Mead.

It is nice that these pins have the employee's names on the, they will always be remembered. These pins show up at swap meets regularly if anyone is interested but the silver and especially the gold ones are not that common most likely because of their precious metal and with gold valued at almost \$2000 an ounce, these will fetch a good price. In 1935 Studebaker came up with their 2nd employees service pin type, going from the larger medal type to the lapel pin type. They still only awarded 5 and up to 20 years of service. Personally, I think these were the most attractive device pins they gave out.



They stayed with the copper, bronze, silver, and gold but the gold dropped to 10K. Studebaker stayed with this style of service pin until 1948. They needed to upgrade their pins because by this time there were many employees that had way more then 20 years of service. In 1949, Studebaker brought out their 3rd series of service pins, nicknamed the "Redball" This series was used until the South Bend plant closed its doors in 1963.





This series dropped the likeness of JM and just used the Studebaker name along with the year of service. These were in 5-year increments but instead of just up to 20 years they went all the way to 60 years of service. My collection includes up to 35 years always looking to expand my collection. Studebaker starting with the 25-year pin put jewels into the pins, pearl in 25, ruby in 30. Diamonds were added in high years.

I have included a 40-year pin with 2 Rubys owned by Cliff Tattersall.

Pins above 40 years can tend to get expensive, and I understand that only 2 of the 60-year service pins were ever given out and 1 of these went to the grave with the recipient and that a couple were made up later with unused blanks found after the plant closed. The 4th and final series probably are the rarest since they were only given out during the final couple of years that all Studebakers were produced up here in the Hamilton plant. These are basically the same as the "Redball" pins with the inclusion of CANADA below Studebaker.



My collection includes a 5-, 15- and 20-year pin. To my knowledge no jewels were put into any of the Canadian pins. Like the previous series the 20-year pin and up were 10K gold. I have seen a 10-year pin and they are silver, and the 5 year is copper. From my research I figure there was at least one 45-year pin given out in the final series. One interesting pin Studebaker gave out but not a service pin was what has been called "The Widows pin"



Studebaker supplied a lot to the war effort and that included 5,611 employees that signed up to defend our way of life, 111 of these did not come home. Studebaker awarded these pins to their closest relative; these are scarce and is one of my most treasured Studebaker items.

I hope this has informed some SDC members on Studebaker employee service pins. Collecting these pins has been one of my many Studebaker passions and I'm always looking to add to my collection.

Studebaker Car Care and Tech Tips By Peter Yuen

Wheels

Any of the late 70's through '89 Chrysler, Dodge, Plymouth rear wheel drive cars will work. Some are wider than others. The '85- Fifth Avenue wheels work great on Studebakers having disc brakes up front, plus they hold the original hub caps too. Wheels from rear wheel drive, full size models of Fords fit on Studebakers as well. When looking for replacement wheels, make sure that the holes are not elongated. The elongation is a result of wear due to the wheel being on a car driven when it was loose. Regardless of whether you use Ford or Chrysler wheels as replacements use the Ford or Chrysler nuts which are 13/16" instead of the 3/4" ones that Studebaker used. "Why replace the wheels," you may ask.... It may be that your wheels are worn or cracked around the bolt holes or you may wish to use wider tires than the original ones. After changing tires or wheels, be sure to tighten them. Studebaker specifies 75 -to-83-foot pounds of torque for tightness. If tires and wheels are changed at a tire shop, ask that they use a torque limiting wrench for 75-foot pounds of torque. Some shops will try to tell you that their impact wrench used is set at the right pressure . . . Don't believe it! Over tightening or under tightening can cause wheel damage which is not immediately apparent. Over tightening can cause stripping of the treads on the nut and wheel stud. Also, you may have trouble to remove the wheel with the tools or strength that you have.

Grinding Noises

When you apply the brakes and hear a grinding noise that sounds like metal being scraped together, it may mean that you have worn brake shoes on drum brakes or worn disc pads on the disc brake system. It is generally caused by normal wear over a long period of time and it is the one problem that should not be ignored. Brake troubles always get worse. If you suspect that the scraping noise is coming from the braking system, get it checked out as quickly as possible. The cause of the scraping noise is bad and the damage that the scraping causes accelerates from bad to worse very quickly. Since the braking system is considered to be the most important in your car as far as safety is concerned, give it the attention that it needs. As a driver, your life depends on it.


Brian Chappell writes:

The replacement seats came from a late 90's Eagle Talon, the owner wanted to install racing seats, that was 5 or 6 years ago, just got around to getting these installed now. The brackets that we made still need to the 'dressed-up a little' & painted. The seats are very comfortable, the backs adjust, there is lumbar adjustment on the driver's seat & the bolsters on the seats & backs just seem to cuddle one right in there.

I should have done this 5 years ago, but only got around to it this year.

Jerry Blount writes:

Several years ago, I wrote a column about original clutch pressure plate assemblies as used on '55 to '64 V-8 Studebaker. The point of that column was to list the various diameters used - 10"; 10-1/8"; 10-1/4"; and 10-1/2" and the rating in pounds for the different model applications. 1545 lbs. to 2050 lbs. with several in the 1700 - 1800 lbs. range. I wanted to point out that most aftermarket clutches were more like 2200 lbs. and thus could lead to clutch linkage failure, not to mention a tired left foot. Some Studebaker parts dealers were selling a commonly available American Motors/Jeep 10-1/2" clutch pressure plate rated at 2220 lbs.

I chose to rarely sell this part (only for heavy duty use); my preference was something close to the original Studebaker listings. So, I sold 10" and 10-1/4" pressure plates whenever I could, since these would be in the 1600 - 1800 lbs. range.

Recently my California wholesaler Studebaker parts supplier chose to discontinue selling remanufactured 10" pressure plates, mainly due to lack of people willing to do the rebuilding process. Fortunately, he now has a source for new 10-1/2" pressure plates, rated at 1450 lbs. - noted as "standard duty". The "heavy duty" version is 2000 lbs. The '55 - '64 Studebaker V-8 flywheels have a bolt pattern that will accept 10" thru 10-1/2" pressure plates, so a 10-1/2" pressure plate will readily replace a 10" pressure plate. You should either reface your flywheel (good idea anyway) or use a 10" disc.




